Centres and Peripheries in Banking - The Historical Development of Financial Markets

The Editors

Philip L. Cottrell was born in Buckinghamshire in 1944. He is Professor Emeritus of Financial History as well as honorary visiting fellow at the University of Leicester. Throughout his career he has employed the particular viewpoint of history and economic and social history offered by finance with a focus on money, credit, and capital. This has led to a close cooperation with the *European Association for Banking and Financial History (EABH) e.V.*, where he served as chairman of the Academic Council from 2002 to 2004. Among various articles Cottrell most recently published *The Ionian Bank; an imperial institution, 1839-1864 in 2007, but he has also co-edited well-*assorted editions of the *EABH* studies in banking and financial history. Furthermore, he edited and established the *Financial History Review*, together with his colleague Youssef Cassis, until 2004.

Even Lange was born in 1946 and is Professor of Modern History at the University of Norway, Oslo. Influenced by Schumpeter his research field focuses on economic history. He worked at the National Archival Services of Norway and later led the Centre for Business History at the Norwegian School of Management. Before his appointment as Professor at the University of Oslo in 2002, he worked at the Norwegian Institute for Social Research for two years. From 1995 to 2002 he was a member of the Academic Advisory Council of the European Business History Association. His first major work was in 1985 *Treforedlingens epoke 1895–1970*, volume four of *Fra Linderud til Eidsvold Værk*, and earned him the doctorate in 1987. In 1997 he published *Samling om felles mål 1935– 1970*, volume eleven of *Aschehougs Norgeshistorie* on general Norwegian history. His latest publication was *The Survival of Family Dynasties in Shipping* in cooperation with T.Gulbrandsen in *International Journal of Maritime History, XXI, no 1*, (pp.175-200) in 2009.

Ulf Olsson is/was Professor of Economic History, Stockholm School of Economics. Among his publications are monographs of L.M. Ericsson and of the Stockholms Enskilda Bank as well as *The Creation of a Modern Arms Industry*.
