Stefano Battilossi has been an Associate Professor at the Department of Economic History and Institutions at Universidad Carlos III since 2007, where he had already been a visiting professor since 2001. Educated at the University of Bologna, Battilossi had graduated *Laurea cum laude* from the University of Bologna in 1986, before he received his PhD in History from the University of Turin in 1991 and obtained a Master of Science in Financial Analysis in 2003. Consequently, his research interests include international banking in the 20th century, the political economy of financial repression and liberalisation, or the development of capital markets in the 20th century. In 2009 Battilossi became responsible editor for *EABH's* flagship, the *Financial History Review*, and has been serving on *EABH's* Academic Advisory Council since 2007.

Jaime Reis is a researcher at the Institute of Social Sciences of the University of Lisbon. In addition to his MA in International Relations from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy in 1968, he obtained his PhD in History in 1975 from the University of Oxford. Furthermore, he holds the degree of "agregação" from the Faculdade de Economia of the Universidade Nova de Lisboa since 1984. He is a founder and former president of the European Historical Economics Society, from 1998 to 1999, as well as former member of the Committee of the International Association for Economic History from 1994 to 2002. He has worked on topics relating to agriculture, money and banking, labour and human capital, and the impact of institutions on economic growth
